Prep Uniform

Blue/sky blue sport knit shirt with school logo
Blue sport shorts with school logo
Blue short socks
Plain white joggers
Blue hat with logo (2 styles available)
Interhouse sports polo shirt

Sports Uniform (Years 1 – 6)

Blue/sky blue sport knit shirt with school logo (worn untucked)
Interhouse sports polo shirt (worn untucked)
Blue sport shorts with school logo
White short (not ankle) socks
Plain white joggers
Blue hat with logo (2 styles available)
Year 6 Leadership Polo Shirt (worn on occasions as agreed, untucked)

Boys – Dress Uniform (Years 1 – 6)

Blue checked unisex short sleeved shirt
Blue long leg shorts
Blue short (not ankle) socks
Plain black leather shoes
Blue hat with logo (2 styles available)

Girls – Dress Uniform (Years 1 – 6)

Blue checked short sleeved dress **OR**
Blue checked unisex short sleeved shirt (worn untucked) with blue culottes
Blue short socks (with an option of blue stockings in winter)
Plain black leather shoes
Blue hat with logo (3 styles available)

All Students Cooler Weather Uniform

Blue fleece jacket with school logo
(optional) Matching blue fleece track pants
*microfibre jacket, trackpants and shorts commenced phase out 2022 & cease wearability in 2025

School Bag with logo

The Sts Peter and Paul's school bag with logo is compulsory and available from the uniform supplier.

Jewelry

The selection is primarily based on the need for school pride, Workplace Health and Safety standards and the requirements of a 'uniform' dress code. Students may wear:

- A watch (that does not have internet access, irrespective of ability to disable this function)
- One earring per ear. Earrings must be sleepers or studs which are plain gold or silver.
- A Medic Alert Indicator

Hair and Hair Attire

The School Administration reserves the right to insist on appropriate hair design, cut and colour. The criteria being such that things be modest and in keeping with the need for uniformity and striving to comply with health standards (e.g. hair tied tightly to reduce the risk of head lice).

- Hair must be clean, neatly groomed and shoulder length hair must be tied back off the face
- Hair attire e.g. ribbons, scrunchies, headbands, plain hairclips must be blue (or STSPP check uniform) in colour
- Hair **MUST NOT** be artificially coloured

For Sts Peter and Paul's School the following are examples of unacceptable hairstyles:

- Hairstyles that draw undue attention to the student including lines, patches and patterns cut into the hair
- Cuts which make the scalp visible (minimal blade three)
- Styles that fall below the eyebrows or below the collar, or hair which needs to be brushed behind the side to prevent it from falling below the eyebrows
- Hairstyles with sudden gradations in length
- Hair which is coloured or bleached

Other Points

- Hats must be worn at all times when students are involved in outside activities
- Blue (formal) and white (sport) socks which offer ankle protection should be worn
- Children **MUST NOT** be at school with:
 - Coloured varnished nails
 - Tattoos or decals
 - Body piercing other than ears
 - Make-up
 - Writing on the skin
- All school clothing should be clearly marked with the student's name
- All students should present a note of explanation for any long term variance (i.e. more than one day) of the code of dress requirement
- School staff will ensure the school Code of Dress is adhered to, and will take appropriate action when necessary

Sts Peter and Paul's School depends very much on the support of parents in seeing that the uniform is worn correctly, and that items clearly not in line with the values, ethos and tone of the school are not worn. Thus parents/carers are required to support full and correct implementation of the Code of Dress and accept consequences for their child/ren should the code not be followed.
