Curriculum & Opportunity Year 5 & 6

Improving educational outcomes for all young Australians is central to the nation's social and economic prosperity and will position young people to live fulfilling, productive and responsible lives. The Alice Springs Education (Mparntwe) Declaration has two distinct but interconnected goals:

Goal 1: The Australian education system promotes excellence and equity Goal 2: All young Australians become:

- o confident and creative individuals
- o successful lifelong learners
- o active and informed members of the community.

With this declaration in mind, at Sts Peter and Paul's School, Year 5 and 6 students engage in the following Key Learning Areas from the Australian Curriculum and Brisbane Catholic Education:

- Religion
- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Humanities & Social Sciences
- Health and Physical Education
- The Arts
- Technologies

At Sts Peter and Paul's School, Specialist Teachers conduct lessons for the following Learning Areas:

- The Arts (Music, Drama, Visual Arts)
- Health and Physical Education
- Movement and Physical Activity (Prep -Year 6)
- Languages other than English (Japanese)

In addition, various co-curricular activities are offered on school site including:

- Guitar and piano tuition
- Tennis coaching and Go Sports
- AFL Auskick & Rookies to Reds clinics
- Chess Mates
- Robotics/Programming

- Maths Olympiad
- Debating
- District Trials for various sports (golf, hockey, basketball, netball, track & field, rugby league etc)

Reporting of Student Learning:

- At Sts Peter and Paul's School, Parent Information Sessions are held at the beginning of the school year to outline class expectations, routines, curriculum, assessment and general information.
- In line with the current Australian Government legislative requirements, formal reporting relating to student progress and achievement takes place twice per year the end of Semester 1 and the end of Semester 2. A five-point scale is utilised to provide parents and students with a clear indication of achievement in each Key Learning Area. Reports are uploaded electronically to the Parent Portal at the end of Semester 1 and Semester 2.

- Informal reporting between parents and teachers is encouraged. Appointments throughout the year between parents and teachers are welcomed to share information and build positive relationships to support student learning. These meetings can be initiated by the teacher or parents.
- Formal Parent Teacher Interviews occur at the end of Term 1 to share information regarding students work habits and achievements. Celebrations of Learning will also occur throughout the year.

Student in Years 5 & 6 continue engagement within the 1:1 iPad program (commenced at Sts Peter and Paul's School in Year 4) primarily using Microsoft Teams & One Note platforms to access and engage in learning experiences.

- Contemporary learning environments offer flexibility and opportunities for collaboration, independence and connectivity to global resources. This sort of anytime, anywhere learning is supported by access to portable technologies (eg. iPads).
- Sts Peter and Paul's School promotes contemporary learning and teaching practices. In the Australian Curriculum, the Information and Communication Technology (ICT) capability is integrated into all curriculum areas of the student's learning.
- Students develop the ICT capability as they learn to use ICT effectively and appropriately to access, create and communicate information and ideas, solve problems and work collaboratively in all learning areas at school and in their lives beyond school.
- ICT capability involves students learning to make the most of the digital technologies available to them, adapting to new ways of doing things as technologies evolve and limiting the risks to themselves and others in a digital environment. (Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority [ACARA])



A day 'Learning Together For Life' Year 5 & 6

Sts Peter and Paul's School Year 5 & 6 students spend the day with their class teacher engaging in learning and teaching according to the Australian Curriculum and Brisbane Catholic Education Religion Curriculum.

Additionally, students participate in our leadership program via which EVERY student experiences an active leadership role across four committees throughout the year. Student leaders ideate and plan for a student led whole school Wellbeing Week each term. Furthermore, students participate in retreats that compliment pertinent themes such as leadership and wellbeing through the course of their Years 5 & 6 journey.

Morning Tea and Lunch breaks are supervised by teachers and support staff, with a variety of spaces available to students (e.g. hall, under-croft, rooftop playground, courts and oval). Our Teacher Librarian facilitates daily activities within the library to support student interest (e.g. coding, robotics, chess etc). The school tuckshop is open 3 days per week.

Our Year 5 & 6 classrooms are located within one building and benefit from a common space where students can break out into flexible learning spaces where they can explore their learning environment preferences to maximise learning.

For day-to-day communications, the classroom teacher holds the primary pastoral relationship with families. Additionally, families are supported by a dedicated Upper Years Support Teacher Inclusive Education and a dedicated Upper Years School Leadership Team member.
